The Conway Cardboard Car Derby is held as part of the Conway EcoFest, scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 11, 2010, from 10 to 4 p.m. at Laurel Park in Conway. Safety checks for cars begin at 9:30 a.m.

The event, similar to the gravity propelled Soap Box Derbies or cardboard sled races, is intended as an enjoyable means to promote teamwork at home, work, or play, as well as demonstrate the intrinsic worth of discarded or reused materials.

This is open to individuals, families, clubs, youth groups, schools and commercial businesses. Vehicles may be simple, silly, elaborate, promotional and/or highly engineered designs. Let your imagination go!

RULES AND REGULATIONS
Conway EcoFest: Cardboard Car Derby
September 11, 2010

Purpose: to promote teamwork at home, work, or play, as well as demonstrate the intrinsic worth of discarded, recyclable and/or reused materials, The event is similar to the gravity propelled Soap Box Derbies and cardboard sled events.

This Derby is not sanctioned by any recognized competition agency and is intended as an enjoyable event for all ages.

Participation is open to businesses, organizations, youth groups, students, and adults. The two Derby Divisions: Youth 8-17 (drivers); and Adult, 18+ (drivers). Awards for a variety of efforts will be presented, as designed below.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented shortly after the Derby. The People's favorite will be presented later in the day. All participants will receive recognition and an opportunity to showcase their efforts.

Awards will be presented to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each division in the following two categories:

- Furthest Distance:
- Fastest Time (50' feet) - if done safely!

A few other awards to be presented include but are not limited to the following:

- Most creative use of recycled materials
- Best Conway Spirit
- The People's Choice

REGISTRATION (Application) DEADLINE: Monday, Sept. 6th.

Online registration (www.conwayecofest.com) is preferred. Signed liability forms and fees (see below) may be brought to the Derby beginning at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 11.

There will be NO day of event registration without prior approval of event coordinators (contact us through our Web site or contact Joey at joey.lamb@hp.com).

NOTE: If you are entering two drivers for the same car, please submit two applications.

FEES and LIABILITY WAIVERS:

- A signed entry form and liability waiver is required from all entrants/drivers. If you have applied online, you may just bring the form and fee with you to the EcoFest Derby. Minors must have a parent or guardian sign the entry form/liability release, and have a responsible adult in attendance;
- Registration fees for those who register now through August 1, is \$10 per driver; \$15 after that date. Please indicate if you need a fee waiver on your online application.

DIVISIONS and DRIVERS:

Divisions are Youth Drivers (8-17) and Adult Drivers (18 and up).

- Drivers must be at least eight years old;
- Drivers must have participated in the construction of the car in some way;
- All drivers must wear protective headgear (DOT certified helmet and protective gear is preferred). Protective clothing and pads are recommended but not mandatory.
- Each driver will be allowed at least one practice run;
- Each driver is guaranteed a minimum of two competitive runs;
- A maximum of two (2) separate drivers may use the same vehicle to race (each should complete an application);
- No reckless driving is permitted.

OPTIONAL BUT RECOMMENDED:

PRE-QUALIFYING, SAFETY CHECKS, and TEST RUNS will be conducted at Laurel Park approximately three (3) weeks prior to the event to allow time for people to modify their cars if needed. Please watch this Web Site for dates and details.

DAY OF RACE (Sept. 11, 2010)

CHECK-IN, AND SAFETY CHECKS:

NOTE the times listed below may be adjusted a bit, depending on the number of entries received. Approximately two weeks prior to the EcoFest, you will be notified of the exact time and location of where to unload. Please watch the Web site, www.conwayecofest.com, too.

- Check-in and Safety Inspection at 9:30 a.m. at the south parking lot of Laurel Park
 - A "Safety Board/Derby Marshals" comprised of at least two adult volunteers will be established to determine if entries meet the requirement and intent of the Conway EcoFest's Cardboard Car Derby guidelines. All decisions made by the Safety Board are final.
 - Drivers must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the "Safety Board/Derby Marshals" that the braking and steering systems are functional, the cart is structurally sound, and the driver can operate the cart.
- Practice runs start between 10 - 10:15 a.m. The Derby starts at approx. 11:00 a.m.
- Cars/vehicles must remain on the premises until at least 4 p.m. and be removed no later than 6 p.m. on Sept. 11, unless prior arrangements have been made with organizers.
- Awards ceremony to follow the completion of the Derby.

CONSTRUCTION

Chassis and Propulsion:

1. Absolutely no drive power mechanisms. Gravity propulsion only.
2. Any and all ballast (weight) must be securely fastened to the car.
3. No go-cart chassis's, bed frames, wheelchairs, bicycles or skateboards. The EcoFest's "Safety Board/Derby Marshals" will rule on any questionable entries. Time and distance penalties will be applied for each infraction. Their decisions are final.

4. **SIZE REQUIREMENTS** (the car body must surround the driver, no open cars (without car bodies) will be allowed):
- **Length:** Cars must not exceed 84 inches in length; the length of the wheelbase must be a minimum of 60 inches. **IMPORTANT:** The car body should not protrude more than 2" past the tires (not past the front of front tires, or back of the back tires). If it does, it must be a minimum of 16" off the ground in order to safely clear the transition ramps. Winners will be based on when the wheels cross the finish lines.
 - **Width:** The **maximum width** of the car and the wheelbase (exterior of wheel-to-wheel) must not exceed 32 inches, **and the minimum width** of the wheelbase must not fall below 28 inches.
 - **Wheels:** Should be either 10" or 12". A limited supply of **FREE, 10" plastic wheels** are available. If interested, please contact us through our Web site or at conwayecofest@gmail.com, or contact Joey at joey.lamb@hp.com

NOTE: The launching ramp is 19' long and will be placed at an angle of approximately 45 degrees – please keep this in mind when designing your vehicle.

Remember the **optional early test runs**, three weeks prior to event...could be helpful! Watch the Web site for the exact date and details.

5. Braking Systems: All vehicles must have an adequate braking system (rear-wheel brakes are recommended). Drivers will need to demonstrate the ability to safely and quickly stop the car in order to qualify and participate in the derby.
6. The vehicle must be made of all paper products with the exception of the steering and braking systems, wheels, and wheel mounts. The front axle should be built to withstand holding your vehicle at a 45-degree angle on the ramp (for a few minutes) while preparing for the race. The truer the vehicle is to the intent of the Derby cars (paper and cardboard), the more bonus points your vehicle will earn.
7. The monetary outlay (if any) to construct these vehicles should be very minimal because recycled/reused materials are encouraged ... not to exceed \$50. If strong cardboard or cores are needed and you can't find any appropriate paper/cardboard, you may contact Dan at International Paper, dan.gladwin@ipaper.com, to pick some up.
8. Tips for cutting cardboard tubes, making strong corners, and general construction tips for working with cardboard, can be found on our Web site, www.ConwayEcoFest.com.
9. Duct tape may be used, but no fiberglass, enamel paint, or compounds that are harmful to the environment may be used. All vehicles must be either reused or recycled when its useful life is over. Owners will be responsible for doing so.
10. Keep (and bring) a pictorial of the construction phase of your vehicle ... this will be a great keepsake for you, too!

General Info.

- Unsportsmanlike behavior will not be tolerated. Good Sportsmanship is required both from participants and spectators.
- The event is intended as enjoyment for all and is not sanctioned by any recognized competition agency.
